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Inside The d'Orsay: A Residential Complex Combining Manhattan Design With French Influences

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Renowned French architect and interior designer [Jacques Garcia](#) is bringing his elegant and timeless design back to Manhattan with the [d'Orsay](#), his first full-residential development project.

Garcia, known for his work on the [Hotel Côstes](#) in Paris and the [NoMad Hotel](#) in Manhattan, says the contemporary residential building will be located at 211 West 14th Street. The location places the d'Orsay in the crossroads of the West Village, Chelsea, the Meatpacking District and the High Line. The residential complex was inspired by its surrounding neighborhoods—the building's exterior, which was designed by [Hill West Architects](#), takes note of the wide streets, styles and sun exposures seen in the d'Orsay's neighborhoods, Garcia says.

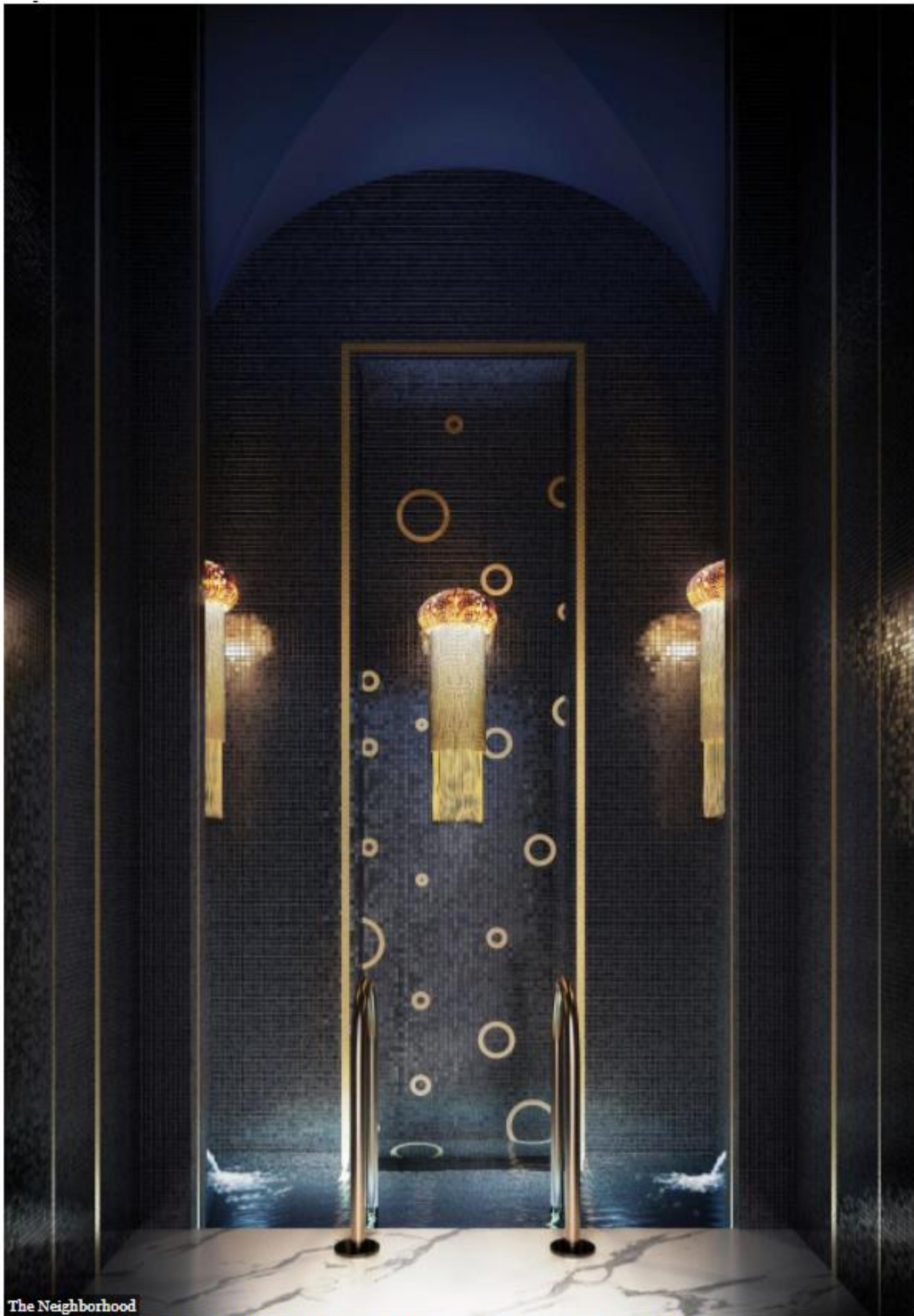
"For the interior design, we were inspired from the Meatpacking District's industrial design, with large metal beams, emphasizing the interior's structure," Garcia says. "We added a personal touch of French influences with special plaster details to cover the walls, custom furniture designs and use of my signature color, red."

In addition, Garcia says the location is ideal because it will provide residents with easy access to various dining, shopping and cultural experiences. "The d'Orsay is the first residential building to address buyers who desire to have a contemporary home in the next place-to-be neighborhood in New York City," he says.

The development will also boast a skylight fitness center, full-time concierge/doorman, rooftop garden, drawing room and bicycle storage. The skylight fitness center will feature hotel spa quality amenities, setting it apart from typical residential gyms.

"We want the residents to enter a 5-star private spa with an incredible art deco plunge pool, whilst a room adjacent to the steam room can be booked for facial or body treatment," Garcia says.
